### **Joint MARAD/SOCP Anti-Piracy Training and Technology Demonstration** **November 1<sup>st</sup>, 2011 at Baltimore Harbor, Maryland**

The Ship Operations Cooperative Program (SOCP) cordially invites maritime industry representatives to attend our joint MARAD/SOCP Anti-Piracy Training and Technology demonstration to be held at 399 East Cromwell Street, Baltimore, MD 21230 on November 1st, 2011.

The goals of this event are:

- Conduct a training and technology demonstration utilizing counter-piracy tactics and non-lethal devices.
- Provide the opportunity for the U.S. shipping industry, labor and government agencies to observe and evaluate the available technology and services available to reduce the risks associated with piracy.

All maritime industry and labor representatives are invited to attend. Attendees will be responsible for providing:
